Eleanor "Ellie" Williams who resides in Building 2 has lived an extraordinary 95 years of life!

When she was eighteen-years-old she joined the United States Naval Reserve Women's Branch as a part of the Women Accepted for Volunteer Emergency Service better known as the WAVES.

She was stationed in Gainesville, Ga. The WAVES was established to fill spots for the men who were deployed during World War II. Ellie worked in an office where she took secret coded messages. While working for the Navy, she met her husband Ray, who was a Naval officer. Her time with the Waves ended at age twenty. Ellie and Ray moved from Georgia to Pennsylvania, then to New York. While in New York, Ray got news he was going to be

deployed for the Korean War. Ellie moved to San Diego, California with family while Ray was deployed. By this time, they had three children. After California, they moved back to Pennsylvania, then to New Jersey where Ellie continued to be a stay at home mother and did a tremendous amount of volunteer work. Ray later accepted a job at Lockheed Martin and moved his family back to Georgia. Ellie taught Sunday school for multiple years and served as a Pink Lady at Union General Hospital for twelve years.

Throughout the years, Ellie has done a lot of traveling around the world. She has visited England multiple times, since that was where her husband was from, and they still had family living there. She's also been to

Ireland, Wales, Scotland, Alaska, but her favorite places were Hawaii and the Bahamas. She loved the warmer climates and the beautiful flowers of Hawaii and the Bahamas. Ellie says her favorite thing about living at Stonehenge is that "the caregivers are so caring and kind...I give them an A+."

Her advice for the younger generation is, "Enjoy each day! Don't look back because you cannot change the past. Just enjoy today!"
